DAY 1 - SUNDAY, JULY 2: LOS ANGELES/ THESSALONIKI

We embark upon our journey with an overnight flight to Greece. Prepare yourself for a life-changing experience and get some rest on the flight. Tomorrow, you will be walking where the apostle Paul walked!

DAY 2 - MONDAY, JULY 3: THESSALONIKI

Tonight, we arrive in Thessaloniki. This is the city where Paul was received by Jason. Paul was preaching the Word of God here until he was rushed out of the city. We transfer to our hotel for check-in and a light dinner. (D)

DAY 3 - TUESDAY, JULY 4: THESSALONIKI – PHILIPPI AND KAVALA

This morning after our panoramic tour of Thessaloniki we depart for Philippi. Here, we sit by the Zygakti River and tell the story of St. Paul baptizing Lydia and her friends. We then visit the Baptistery of Lydia. Lydia was the first convert of Paul on European soil, followed by the Philippian jailer. We also visit the ruins of the Forum of Philippi, the Christian Basilicas, the "Prison of Paul" and the Theater. Then we drive to Kavala (Neapolis), the picturesque ancient port of Neapolis of Paul's day (Acts 16:9-11). This is where St. Paul first set foot on the continent of Europe. We view the Byzantine Castle and the Roman Aqueduct before returning to Thessaloniki for dinner and overnight. (B, D)

DAY 4 - WEDNESDAY, JULY 5: THESSALONIKI/ VEREA/ METEORA/ DELPHI

Today, we leave Thessaloniki and drive to **Verea** (biblical Berea of Paul's day), the so called "**Little Jerusalem**" of northern Greece. We travel south to **Meteora**, where we see the **world-famous Byzantine monasteries** that are perched on summits of gray rock peaks of varied and beautiful shapes. Their history goes back to the 14th century when the monks sought refuge in the cliff-side caves, then fled higher to build the original wooden shelters, which were later transformed into monasteries. Afterwards, we continue to **Delphi** where we will have dinner and overnight. (B, D)

DAY 5 - THURSDAY, JULY 6: DELPHI/ ATHENS

After breakfast, we visit **Delphi**, a mountainous city which today is both an archaeological site and a modern town. For the ancient Greeks, Delphi was labeled the "omphalos" (navel) of the earth, and it is here that the eternal flame burned in the Temple of Apollo. Delphi was the site of the **Delphic oracle**, the most important oracle in the classical Greek world. It was also here beginning in 586 B.C. that athletes from all over the Greek world competed

in the **Pythian Games**, one of the precursors to the modern Olympics. After our visit at the **Archeological Museum of Delphi**, we make our way to Athens. During our drive, we will have time to stop and enjoy the **small scenic villages** that cling to the mountainsides. We arrive in Athens and check-in to our hotel. Tonight, we will have time to explore the **Pláka** district, a short walk from our hotel and historical neighborhood of Athens, to have a self -hosted dinner at a local restaurant. Overnight in Athens.

DAY 6 - FRIDAY, JULY 7: ATHENS/ LAVRIO PORT (embarkation)/ MYKONOS

After breakfast, we transfer from our hotel to the Lavrio Port in Athens. Bon Voyage! We set sail early this afternoon aboard Celestial Olympia to begin our three-night/ four-day Greece and Turkey cruise. Our first stop is the quaint isle of Mykonos, called the island of windmills. We arrive at Mykonos, where we disembark and have time on our own to experience the waterfront lined with shops and cafes. We stroll the charming walkways through a maze of white-washed buildings before returning to the ship for dinner and evening activities. (B, L, D)



DAY 7 - SATURDAY, JULY 8: KUSADASI (EPHESUS), TURKEY/ PATMOS

Early this morning we visit the Turkish port of Kusadasi. Here we enjoy a shore excursion to the ruins of Ephesus, whose inhabitants were the recipients of Apostle Paul's famous Epistle to the Ephesians (Acts 18:19-26). The impressive remains of Ephesus include the Agora, the Theater, the Stadium, the Library of Celsus, and the ruins of the Temple of Diana (one of the "Seven Wonders of the Ancient World"). We also visit the House of Mary, where the Virgin Mary is said to have spent her last days. We return to our ship and continue our cruise to island of Patmos, the "Jerusalem of the Aegean". Our Patmos

shore excursion this evening includes visits to the **Monastery of St. John**, on one of the island's highest points, and walk down to the **Grotto of the Apocalypse**, the site of the **apocalyptic Revelations of St. John the Divine**. Tonight, we return to our ship for dinner. (B, L, D)



DAY 8 - SUNDAY, JULY 9: HERAKLION OF CRETE/ SANTORINI

In the morning we arrive at **Heraklion of Crete**, the **ancient** city and cultural heritage site, of Knossos. This city has been identified with Plato's mythical Atlantis from his dialogues of **Timaeus** and **Critias** and is also known in myth most famously through the **story** of **Theseus** and the **Minotaur**. Our shore excursion includes a visit to the ancient Minion Palace of Knossos. During our excursion, we take a short ride through the town of Heraklion and then arrive at the Knossos excavations. Here, Sir Arthur Evan's archaeological discoveries revealed a civilization dating back to 4000 B.C., when a great empire flourished on the island of Crete. Paul left Titus in Crete and gave instructions on appointing church leaders in the towns (Titus 1:5ff). Here we visit the ancient Minion Palace of Knossos. We walk around the large Central Court to view the awe-inspiring Throne Room, the fresco of the "Prince of the Lilies," Grand Staircase, and the Queen's Megaron and apartments. We return to our ship for leisure time and lunch. Late this afternoon we dock at Santorini, the "Black Pearl of the Aegean." Tonight, we depart for Athens, our last night of our cruise. (B, L, D)

DAY 9 - MONDAY, JULY 10: LAVRIO PORT (disembarkation)/ CORINTH/ ATHENS

Early this morning we return to Lavrio Port. We are met by our guide to continue our sightseeing with a visit to Ancient Corinth. This is the once-glorious city near the Isthmus, where Paul met Aquilla and Priscilla and spent a year and a half preaching the Word of God. We visit the "Erastus Inscription," the Archaeological Museum, the Forum, the Temples, and the famous Bema, where Paul stood before Gallio, accused by the Jews of Corinth. We travel to **Diolkos** along the paved trackway across, which small ships and cargo we hauled across the Isthmus. We then drive to the **top of the acropolis** for an overview of the city. Next stop is Cenchreae, the little harbor from which Paul sailed back to Asia, thus ending his second missionary journey. This afternoon, we have a selfhosted lunch at a restaurant overlooking the **Corinthian** canal. We return to Athens for a walking tour to view the architectural wonders of ancient Athens. We follow our guide to the world-renowned Acropolis, to see the Propylea, Erechtheum and Parthenon. We visit Mars Hill, where Paul delivered his speech on the "Unknown God." Then we see the Agora, the ancient center of the economic and public life of the city, where Paul preached to the skeptical Athenians. This evening we gather to enjoy a very special farewell dinner celebration at a local restaurant with music and Greek dancing. This will be a time to share our many joys and memories, and to say goodbye to our Istanbul Extension travelers. Overnight at our hotel. (B, D)

DAY 10 - TUESDAY, JULY 11: ATHENS/ LOS ANGELES

After breakfast we transfer to the airport for our return flights home, cherishing our memories of a beautiful country and the sites we have seen that make Scripture come alive. (B)

Optional Turkey Extension January 11 –14, 2023

DAY 1 - TUESDAY, JULY 11: ATHEN/ ISTANBUL

We depart Athens this morning and arrive at Istanbul Airport. After clearing customs, we will be met by our guide who will show us this fascinating city. Headed towards the city of Istanbul, we will drive through the ancient Roman Walls into the Old City to explore the 4th century Church of St. Savior in Chora (now called "Kariye Mosque"), where it was known to be the keeper of the famous icon of Virgin Mary that was believed to have been painted by Luke the Apostle. We will also stop at the Greek Patriarchate that serves as the head of the Greek Orthodox World. Dinner this evening will be at a local restaurant to experience the famed Turkish cuisine. Overnight in Istanbul. (B, D)

DAY 2 - WEDNESDAY, JULY 12 ISTANBUL

This morning we will visit the **Topkapi Palace** that was built following the Ottomans conquest of Istanbul including the Harem, the section of the palace where family of the sultan lived and, the treasury and kitchens that served thousands that worked within the grounds of the palace every day.

We will continue our sightseeing with a visit to Istanbul Archaeological Museum, where the famed tablet from Hezekiah's Tunnel in Jerusalem as well as various other stunning artifacts from Old Testament sites and civilizations are exhibited. We continue our explorations of the Old City. Then onto the Blue Mosque famed for its turquoise color. Followed by a short stroll through the Roman Hippodrome that today displays the famous Egyptian obelisk, Serpentine Column and Roman columns around which the chariots ran. This afternoon we will visit underground cisterns. Later in the day we will experience the lively atmosphere of the Spice Market dating back to the 17th century, welcoming us with its enchanting smells and colorful display of spices brought from around the world. Dinner and overnight in Istanbul. (B, D)

DAY 3 - THURSDAY, JULY 13: ISTANBUL

Our first visit today will be to the 19th century

Dolmabahce Palace an exceptionally majestic edifice. We
then visit Galata District that reflects the 19th century
face of Istanbul with its palazzo style apartments. We visit
the Pera Museum that displays Kırac Family's private
collection of artworks of both rural and urban Turkish
culture. Later in the afternoon, we visit the Grand Bazaar,

the oldest shopping mall in history. Since 1455, the Grand Bazaar has been the abode of trade **connecting Occident and the Orient**. Enjoy a Turkish coffee while hearing about rugs, tiles, leatherwork in the alleys of 4800 shops. This evening we will take a short ride to the **shores of the Bosphorus** to board our **private motor yacht** for a most **memorable cruise** between the **two continents** gazing at mansions and palaces. Docking at the northern shores of Bosphorus, we will be hosted for a **delicious signature seafood feast**. Overnight in Istanbul. (B, D)

Day 4 - FRIDAY, JULY 14: ISTANBUL/ LOS ANGELES

This morning we will transfer to Istanbul Airport for our international flight. We arrive home filled with wonderful memories, a renewal of our faith and new friendships! (B)



NOTE:

- This is a moderately strenuous tour, walking on ancient archaeological sites, cobblestone streets and hills. For your safety and enjoyment, you should be able to walk a mile briskly and easily climb 100 stairs. Most sites are not handicapped accessible and cannot be accessed by persons with limited mobility.
- While we do our very best to make sure all items listed in your itinerary are included, there are times when conditions beyond our control effect your program/itinerary, including but not limited to air carrier changes, vessel changes, delays, weather, political climate, time constraints, or changes by your group leader and tour guide.
